Agents of Change



The Agents of Change Program is now accepting applications to join the IYCN youth delegation to the Fourteenth session of the Conference of the Parties to the Climate Change Convention and fourth Meeting of the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol (COP14 and COP/MOP4), which will be held at the Poznañ International Fair in Poznañ, Poland, from December 1-12, 2008.

COP14 will determine the future international policy on climate change, and youth must make their voice heard. Between now and December, youth from across the globe will organize to bring a sense of urgency and rationality to the meeting. The future of the

UNFCCC process is up for debate, and with it the future of international action to stop climate change. If the UNFCCC cannot respond to the urgent conclusions contained in the report of the IPCC, the ability of the international mechanism to respond to global challenges might become irrelevant.

This is where we come in. The IYCN delegation, comprised of key leaders in the youth climate & environmental movement from various organizations and backgrounds, will have the unique opportunity to represent Indian youth at the COP. Delegates will work with each other and with international youth in advance of the conference to educate themselves, develop policy priorities, acquire skills in effective lobbying, and engage the broader youth population in action related to international climate policy.

AoC delegates will be expected to engage in substantial preparation and fundraising efforts in the months leading up to




#### A PARTNERSHIP FOR PROGRESS

The organization's primary focus is to become the voice of animals, fighting for their rights and protecting them from human cruelties and the risk of extinction. Srijanita is not only a TEDx Speaker but also a passionate youth animal activist, dedicated to raising awareness about animal rights. Srijanita was selected as a Harvard Innovation fellow in the Crimson Youth Entrepreneurship Society by Harvard University this year. Her efforts were further acknowledged when she received recognition from President George W. Bush's foundation, Points of Light Inspiration Honor Roll. Srijanita's outstanding contributions to both entrepreneurship and social work earned her the Indian Diva Award 2022 in the Entrepreneur and Social Work category, as well as the Child Prodigy Award. # DWISHOJOYEE BANERJEE

Dwishojoyee is an Ashoka young changemaker, a BeVisioneers-Mercedes Benz fellow and has worked with organisations such as World Economic Forum, Save the Children and UNICEF.

The Paper Bag project, by the soft movement, enables school students to come together to upcycle newspapers and make paper bags for distributing it free of cost to small vendors like flower sellers in India, who haven't been able to switch to sustainable alternatives despite the ban on single use plastic bags. So far it has reached over 5000 students in 31 cities via a 70+ member team and have replaced 50,000+ single use plastic bags, starting in 2022.











## RAVI VERMA

Ravi works with communities, governments, and stakeholders to develop green cities, integrating renewable energy, green infrastructure, and equitable practices.

Ravi's climate action project, "Earthinators for a Sustainable Future," was initiated with a strong --- conviction to address the pressing challenges of climate change and create a positive impact in his community.



Sneha is a Conservationist and UNEP - Plastic Tide Turner Ambassador, India.


