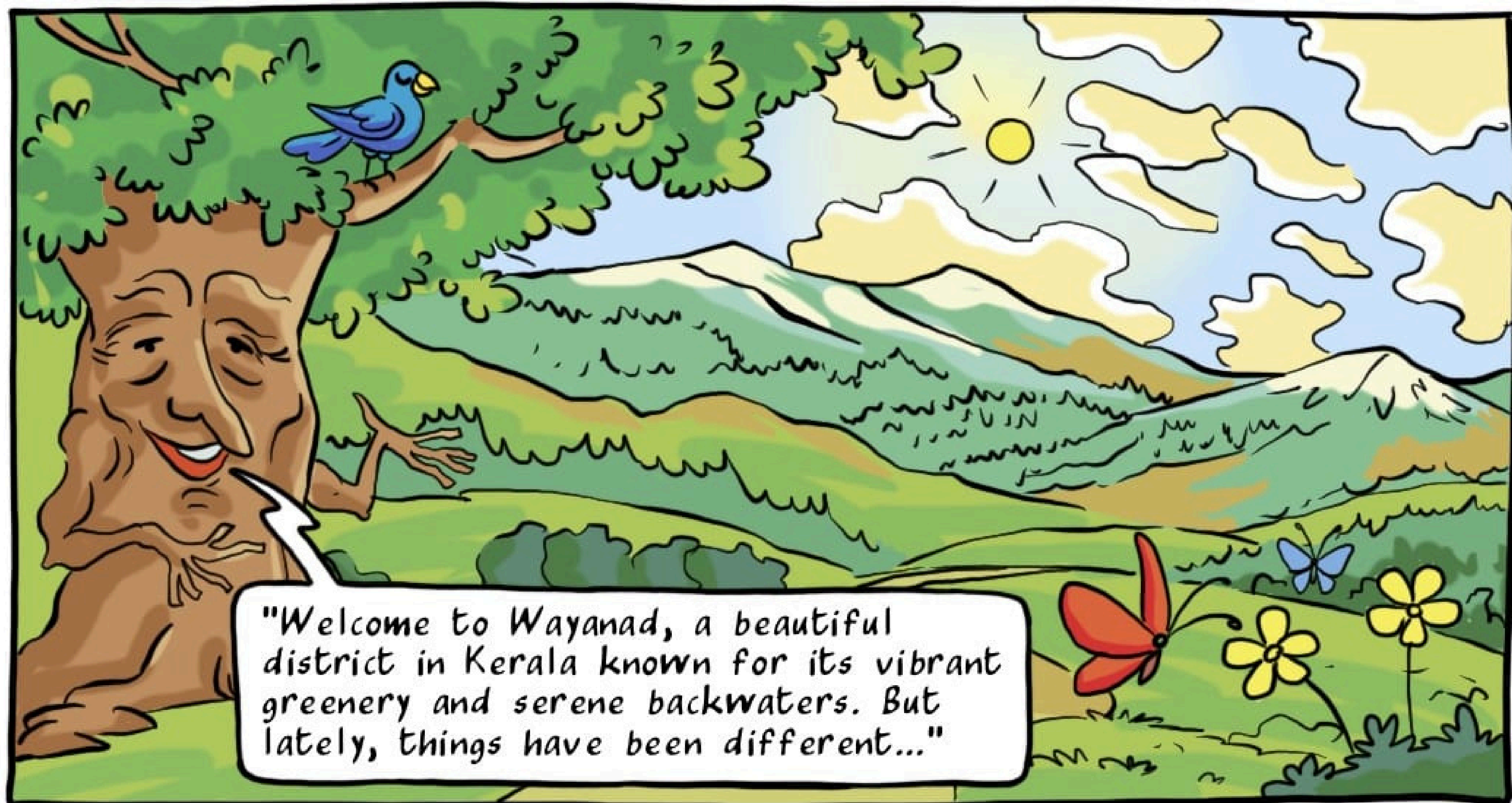


What's Up With Wayanad?

"Aaishi, do you think we'll be okay? The rains are getting worse."

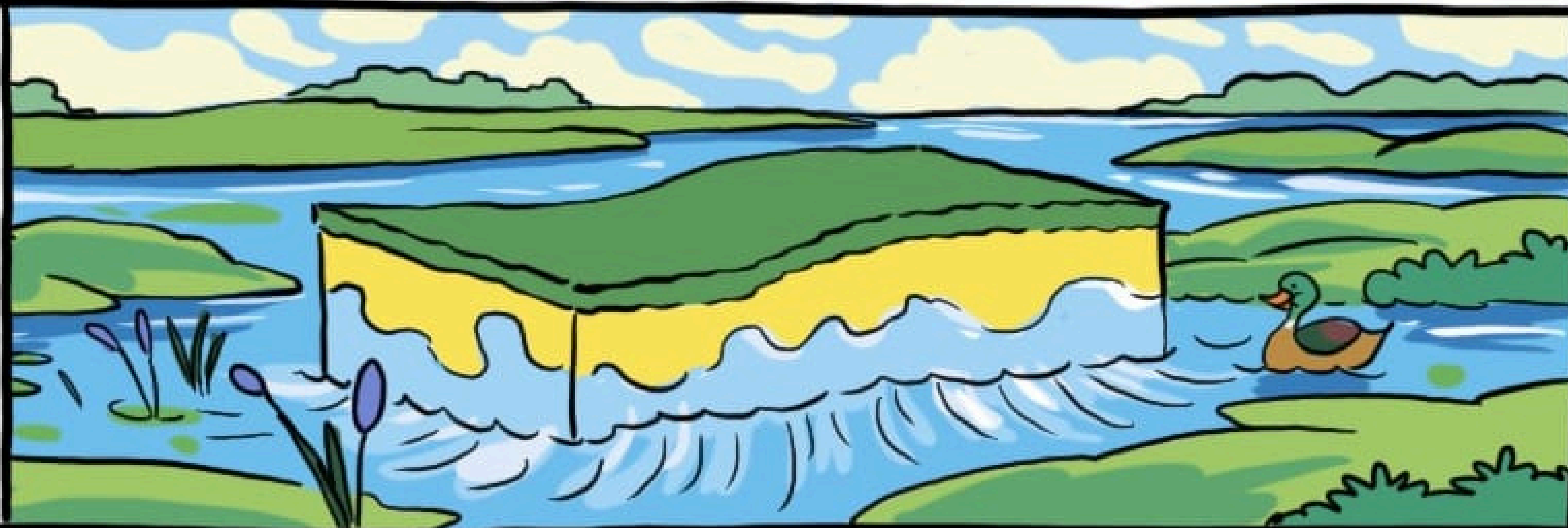
"I don't know, Tashu. But we must stay prepared."

"We need more hands to help move people to safety!"

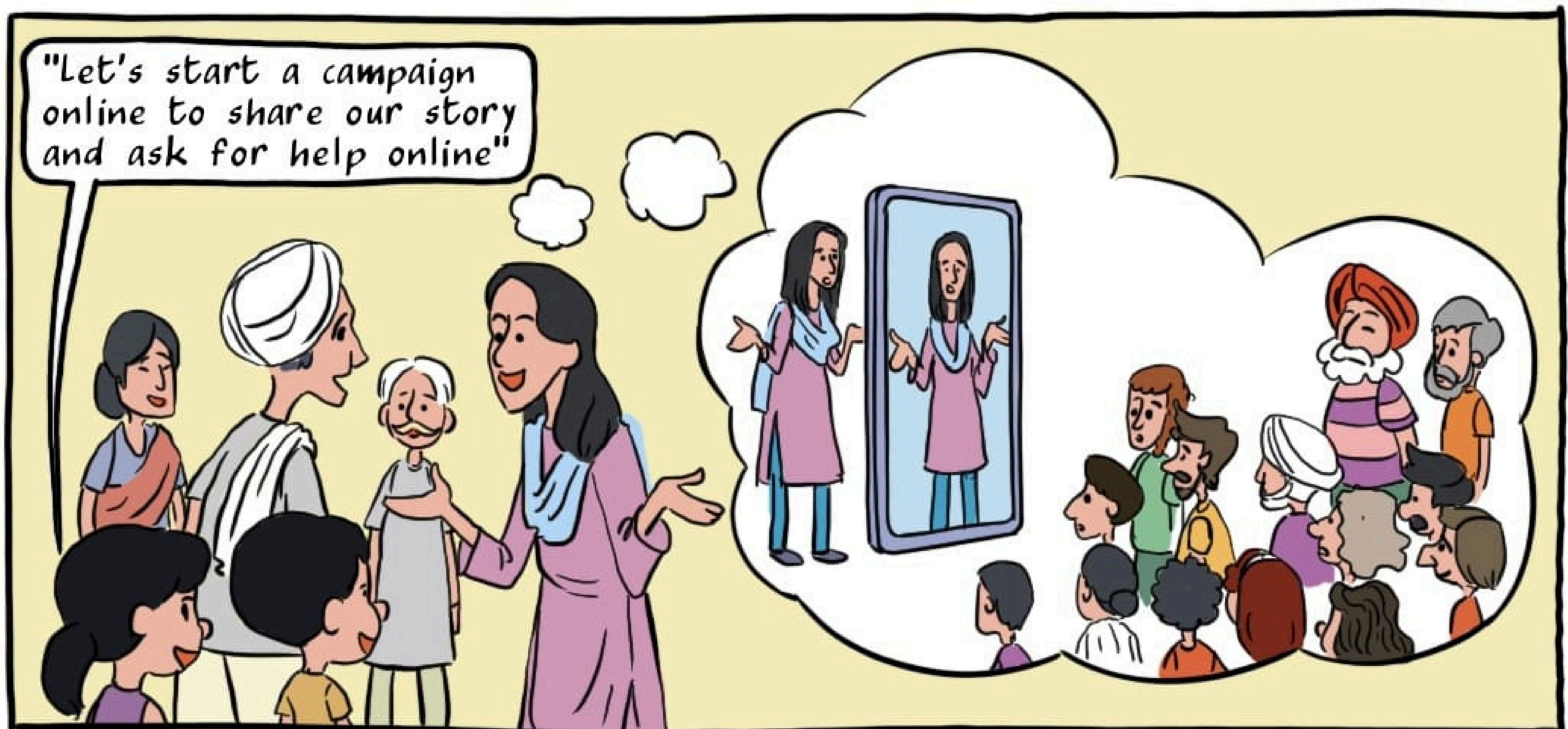
"Yes, let us go to that area"
